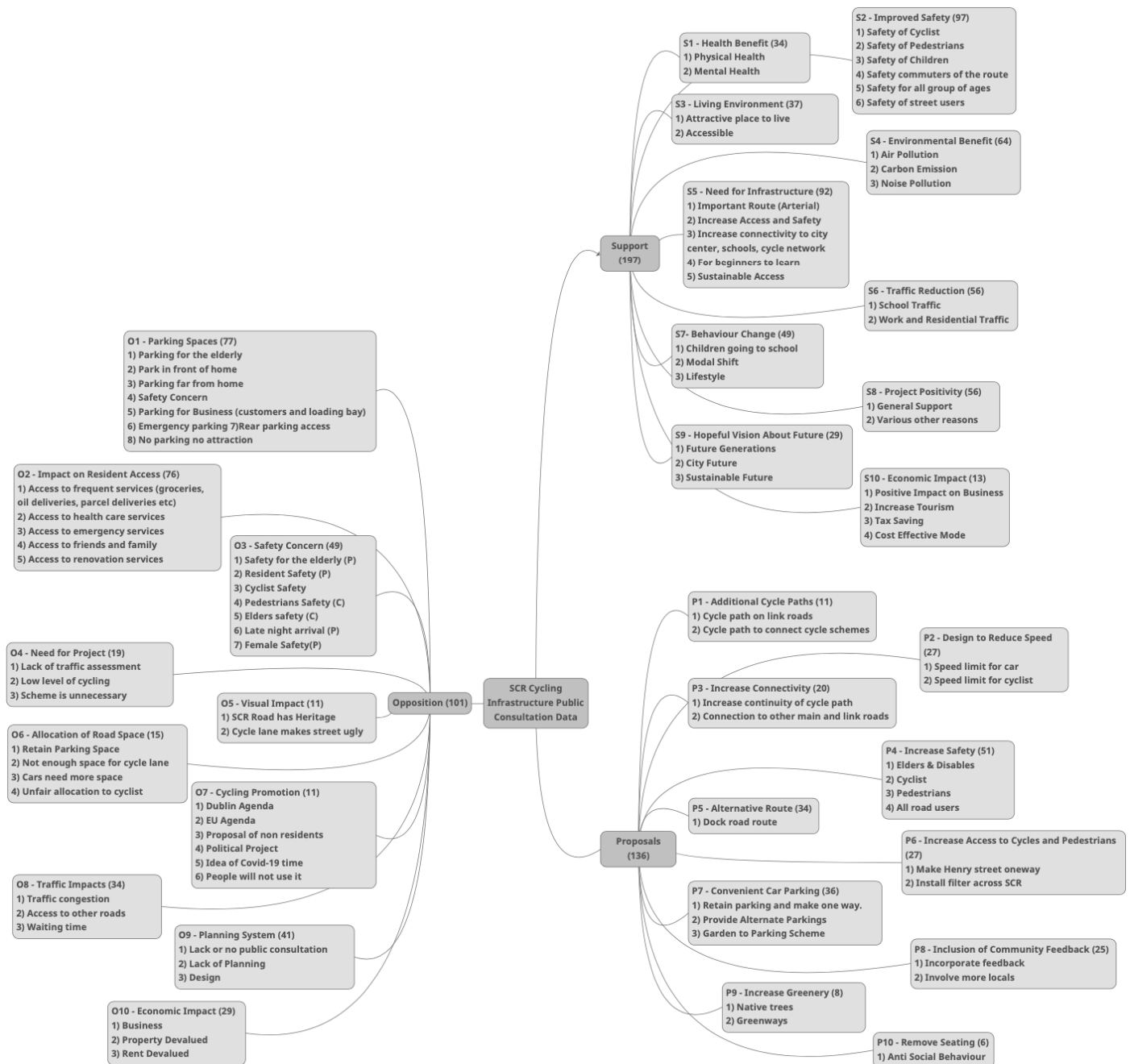


Figure S1. Combined results of themes and sub-themes.

Supplementary material 3

A public consultation process is applicable for significant infrastructural projects planned for the public realm. It involves a number of stages starting with a pre-consultation stage where a project is announced through media or direct communications to potentially affected people. High level project details, including information on its purposes, are disseminated which may include targeted communication to key stakeholders. The next stage involves public consultation events such as public meetings and perhaps workshops. At public meetings, attendees can inform themselves on the details of the project through presentations and asking questions. The next stage involves the submission of feedback where the public can submit observations, positive or negative, on the proposed project within a specified timeframe, usually five weeks for Part 8 planning in Ireland. The final stage involves a review of submissions where concerns may be categorised and changes to plans may be made (Planning and Development Regulations, 2001).
